# CLSA Board Meeting Minutes May 2006

Commodore Rost called the meeting to order at 6:00 at the Boondocks.

**Roll-** Rost, Kerber, Miller, Vokac, Atterberry, Christman, Coatney, Walker, Forrest and Dave and Betty Toland

**Minutes-** The April minutes were approved as published in the Windword.

**Treasurer-** Dave Toland presented the Treasurer's report. He noted that a bill for the committee boat repairs and repairs for the lawnmower will be coming.

**Race Committee-** Gerry Christman reported the first race of the season was a Wind Surfer regatta. It was a success despite the light winds and resulted in 3 new members. The costs of the regatta were covered by the entry fee. The regatta was free to members and \$10 for non-members.

**Education-** Bill Vokac had nothing new to report. Doug Walker thanked the board for covering his insurance for the Youth Sail week. There will be a limit of 8 for the class and four have already signed up.

**Windword/Website-** Bob Miller stated he is pleased with the web hosting company CLSA is using.

**Harbor Master-** Rick Atterberry reported that Work Day went well. A few projects still need to be done. The pavilion needs painting along with repair to one picnic table and painting the tables. Dave Toland said the committee boat deck needs painting. He has been slowly sanding it and could use help. Anyone who has a belt sander is welcome to continue where he left off. Sarah Freyman has planted wildflowers and Bill Vokac planted some maple starts on the point near the pavilion. Dave Toland will donate a bench for the point.

**Membership-** Bill Vokac reported 62 members. He noted the Boat Show would be a great opportunity for attracting new members. He asked members who are sailing that day sail by the point often so that visitors can see the boats in action.

**Boat Show-** Bill Vokac stated that Rob Voigt with Great Lakes Sailboats, LLC will be at the show and Illinois Central Sailboats, a MacGregor dealer will also be there. They will bring a 19-foot and maybe a 26-foot MacGregor. The designer of the Y Flyers may come. The CLSA small boat fleet will be on display either at the marina and/or the beach near the sailboat dock. Bill asked members to let him know if they can provide rides. Gerry Christman said it's a good idea to provide snacks on board for visiting children to keep them entertained while parents are learning about the boats. Rick Atterberry has sent publicity to the Danville, Champaign, Bloomington, Decatur and Peoria papers.

**Commodore-** Craig Rost said George Sodemann will contact the Piatt County engineer about grading the sand that has washed up at the sailboat dock. Another person to contact would be Terry Ferguson who heads the Marina Committee for the county. Greg Forrest said they would be doing roadwork and could possibly use the equipment already there to grade the sand and add some road pack.

The meeting adjourned at approximately 7:30 PM.
